

**TO: All Wholesalers and Associated Trucking Companies/Independent Operators Making Alcohol Deliveries into Maryland.**

**SUBJECT: Companies with trucks making alcohol deliveries must now apply for a 10 Day Vehicle Identification (VID) letter and a Temporary Maryland Alcohol Public Transportation Permit (PT) with the Alcohol, Tobacco, and Cannabis Commission**

This bulletin updates previous guidance issued February 13, 2019.

Beginning October 1<sup>st</sup>, 2023, the Field Enforcement Unit of the Office of the Comptroller will no longer issue Maryland Alcohol Public Transportation Permits (PT) and Vehicle Identification (VID) cards.

Instead, Drivers transporting alcohol into or through the State of Maryland will need to contact the Alcohol, Tobacco, and Cannabis Commission to receive their Public Transportation permit, which enables them to receive either a permanent or temporary Vehicle Identification Card or a 10-Day Vehicle Identification letter.

The recommended way to acquire this permit is by mailing a completed [328 Permit Application](#) and associated fees to the Alcohol, Tobacco, and Cannabis Commission Office, located at 1215 E. Fort Avenue, Suite 300, Baltimore, MD, 21230.

Drivers within Maryland who do not currently have a Maryland PT permit must visit the office of the Alcohol, Tobacco, and Cannabis Commission, located at 1215 E. Fort Avenue, Suite 300, Baltimore, MD, 21230.
